

1 THE PRESIDENT: I am sorry.

2 DELEGATE WHITE: I would like to have --

3 THE PRESIDENT: Just a second, please. The
4 Chair was advised that copies of the substitute proposal
5 had been circulated. Am I in error on that? Mrs. Marx,
6 are there additional copies available?

7 Delegate White, you desire this in order to
8 vote on the pending motion?

9 DELEGATE WHITE: That is right, sir. It
