3 DELEGATE KOSS: Mr. President, the Committee on
4 Suffrage and Elections will meet tomorrow morning at 9
5 o'clock in its offices in the Shaw House. Likewise, the
6 offices will be open this afternoon, and we will welcome
7 members to drop by.

8 THE PRESIDENT: Thank you. I might add a com-
9 ment at this point. Some of you may be wondering about
10 this. I am almost tempted to say to Delegate Koss that
11 we will have to have her repeat that statement for history.
12 The proceedings of the Convention are being stenographical-
13 ly reported, as you can observe, and in addition are
14 being recorded on tape, a tape which will be duplicated
15 and the original sent ultimately to the Hall of Records,
16 with copies to various libraries throughout the State.

17 The tape recorder is wired into the microphone
18 system. You cannot control your microphone. It is con-
19 trolled by the young lady, Miss ^{Kauffman} ~~Kaufman~~, who is sitting
20 at the board. There are some problems with it. If you
21 don't hear that your voice is being transmitted through
