

1 DELEGATE CHABOT: I don't think that that would
2 solve the other problem that I had suggested, that you
3 expanded upon, and I also don't feel that the other matters
4 are of the same consitutional significance as the duty or
5 power or authority to sign or veto bills.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: It would not go to the question
7 the Chair propounded but would go to your amendment, and
8 perhaps we should confine the discussion to that for the
9 moment.

10 Would you think that Delegate Sickles' suggestion
11 would accomplish the purpose of your amendment? Did you
12 follow his suggestion as to where the language would go?

13 DELEGATE CHABOT: Yes. I think that it largely
14 would. I think that, however, it would create its own ties
15 with that section, which by and large I agree with. I think
16 that it would make it possible for the legislature to
17 immobilize the Lieutenant Governor, although the purpose of
18 the Committee was that the Governor have the decision as to
19 the extent to which the Lieutenant Governor can function in
20 the State, and so I would not agree to Delegate Sickles'
21 proposal as an acceptable alternate.
