

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Very well.

2 Delegate Wiedemeyer.

3 DELEGATE WIEDEMEYER: Mr. Chairman, I would like
4 to ask Delegate Chabot, and I may have to state my conclusion
5 in asking the question, but under Section 4.14, veto by the
6 Governor, we find that all bills passed by the General
7 Assembly shall be subject to veto by the Governor.

8 Now, there is not a duty. It is a clear power
9 given the Governor and no one else other than the Governor
10 or the Acting Governor, which under other provisions, the
11 Acting Governor would take over, and an expressed power, an
12 extraordinary power, expressly given to the Governor or the
13 Acting Governor is a vastly different thing from a duty pre-
14 scribed by law, and I would think that if the legislature
15 attempted to give anyone else the power of veto over bills
16 as an extraordinary power, that in view of Section 4.14,
17 such delegation by the legislature would be clearly
18 unconstitutional, in view of the provisions of 4.14, and my
19 answer is, can you not agree with that conclusion?
