

1 Wiedemeyer meant that his question was, can I not agree with
2 that conclusion.

3 I would like to be able to agree with that con-
4 clusion but I think the questions I had asked of the
5 Committee Chairman yesterday, and Delegate Marion's colloquy
6 with the Committee Chairman today, has foreclosed that
7 matter. Had it been established that the Committee that
8 presented it through its Chairman and through its memorandum
9 specifically has included the veto that is a duty. Whatever
10 difference there may be between duties and powers, and
11 consequently, much as I would like to, I cannot agree that
12 this body is in a position to accept your interpretation of
13 that possibility.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Wiedemeyer.

15 DELEGATE WIEDEMEYER: Is it true that an exercise
16 of the power might be discretionary with the Governor, where
17 the exercise of a duty is almost mandatory, where the duty is
18 prescribed by the Constitution or by the legislative enact-
19 ment. It becomes mandatory upon the Governor or the Acting
20 Governor to perform whereas a power is something that is
21 discretionary with him as to whether or not he might want
