

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Morgan.

2 DELEGATE MORGAN: I think that generally is a
3 correct interpretation. For example, the General Assembly
4 might ask the Lieutenant Governor to be a member of some
5 board, or it might ask the Lieutenant Governor to partici-
6 pate in the administration of some particular program. Now,
7 certainly the General Assembly would also have power to do
8 that, and I think even if we strike out these words, the
9 General Assembly would have the power to do that. It seems
10 to me that as a result of this discussion, I would be
11 perfectly willing to agree to Delegate Chabot's amendment
12 if we can also either strike out these words, "as may be
13 prescribed by law and such other duties", or insert after,
14 "as may be prescribed by law", the words, "approved by the
15 Governor", so that the General Assembly could not vest
16 functions in the Lieutenant Governor over the Governor's
17 veto.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Clagett.

19 DELEGATE CLAGETT: I don't believe I am suggesting
20 that, Delegate Morgan, because I believe the Courts would
