

1 General Assembly attempted to delegate to the Lieutenant
2 Governor something which it did not have the constitutional
3 authority to delegate that the Courts would then intervene
4 and declare such an act by the General Assembly as
5 unconstitutional. I would prefer to have the language
6 remain as is, with the clear intent being made a matter
7 of record, as we are doing now, and therefore, then move to
8 my next question. In the light of our interpretation of the
9 first part of this section, that by the delegation to the
10 Lieutenant Governor of duties by the Governor, we are there
11 intending that within the exercise of the Executive powers
12 provided for in this Section 4, or Article 4, the Governor
13 may give to the Lieutenant Governor those powers of his
14 branch of the government that he may see fit and may be
15 necessary under the circumstances.

17 DELEGATE MORGAN: That is correct, but it seems
18 to me that since the Governor can delegate the veto power
19 under the section that authorizes the Governor to deliver
20 the Lieutenant Governor a notification, the Governor will be
21 temporarily unable to perform his duties, it seems to me it
