5 "Section 4.19 Reorganization of the Executive
6 Branch.

7 The General Assembly by law may reallocate offices,
8 agencies and instrumentalities among the principal depart-
9 ments, may increase, modify, diminish and change their
10 functions, powers and duties and may assign new functions,
11 powers and duties to them. The Governor may make changes in
12 the organization of the executive branch, including the
13 establishment or abolition of principal departments, and in
14 the assignment of functions among its units which he considers
15 necessary for efficient administration. Such changes when
16 they require the force of law shall be submitted to the
17 General Assembly in executive orders in statutory form within
18 the first ten days of a regular session and shall become law
19 at a time designated therein, unless specifically disapproved
20 within fifty legislative days after submission by a resolution
21 of disapproval concurred in by a majority of all members of
