

1 the problem is what we are trying to do, and I will repeat,
2 and then take on any questions. We are trying to let the
3 Executive of the State reorganize the departments of the
4 Executive Branch. We are not letting him do it without
5 approval of the Senate. He must have for both houses. One
6 house can stop if it they don't approve of what he is doing.
7 Secondly, we are trying to assure that all those departments
8 other than those that do with education are headed by a
9 single executive. I feel this does it.

13 The Chair recognizes Delegate Maurer.

14 DELEGATE MAURER: I have a parliamentary inquiry,
15 Mr. Chairman.

16 DELEGATE CLARK: State your inquiry.

17 DELEGATE MAURER: I have several substitute amend-
18 ments for the Minority Report Amendments. They carry out
19 into a large extent the intent of the Minority Report,
20 except in the field of education, but my amendments go
21 thro-gh the existing paragraphs in the blue page and, there-
fore, I am not certain how I propose my amendment as a
