

1 changes in the organization of the Executive Branch including
2 the establishment or abolition of principal departments and
3 in the assignment of functions among its units which he
4 considers necessary for efficient administration. That is
5 the section which gives the Governor the reorganization
6 power really coextensive with the reorganization power of
7 the General Assembly.

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Well -- did you finish?

9 DELEGATE MORGAN: I have finished, yes.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: I take it, then, if I understand
11 that answer, that the answer to Delegate Maurer's question
12 is that the phrase "by law" as used in Section 4.18 means
13 a law enacted by the General Assembly and signed by the
14 Governor or enacted by the General Assembly over the veto of
15 the Governor and also means an executive order which has the
16 force of law under Section 4.19. Is that correct?

17 DELEGATE MORGAN: I understood your question was
18 not by law limited to laws enacted by the General Assembly.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: In Section 4.18.

20 DELEGATE MORGAN: In Section 4.18 and approved
21 by the Governor or passed over the Governor's veto.
