

1 an executive order of the type referred to in Section 4.19.

2 Does that answer your inquiry?

3 DELGATE CASE: Well, it does in part, but let us
4 go further and take a change that is more substantial than
5 this and therefore, requires law in the generic sense.

6 Now, do I understand that this Constitution as
7 now interpreted says in effect that even though we are
8 making a change of this nature must be done "by law" that
9 nevertheless, the Governor can by the executive order
10 achieve this end result?

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Morgan.

12 DELEGATE MORGAN: Mr. Chairman, I don't know
13 exactly what the change Delegate Case is referring to.

14 Can you give me an example?

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Case.

16 DELEGATE CASE: I am not sure myself. But let us
17 start off at line 34 of Section 4.19, where these changes
18 acquire the force of law.

19 Now, let us suppose that you are going to
20 reorganize the Department of Budget Procurement into a
