

1 advisory boards would continue, but policy-making boards
2 would be limited to education.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Case.

4 DELEGATE CASE: Mr. Chairman, I know you have been
5 very patient in reading the amended language to the amendment,
6 but I am wondering, sir, whether or not it would be in
7 order for a delegate to request, if there is going to be
8 a substantial amendment that the amendment again be re-
9 printed and put on the delegate's desk.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: The amendment is being printed
11 now. You mean you would rather have it before you to
12 discuss it?

13 Let me suggest this: the amendment, if I give
14 it to you again, you have your blue copy in front of you,
15 rather than Amendment 17; I think you could mark your blue
16 copy very readily without a great deal of writing.

17 This is not for the purpose of stating the amend-
18 ment, but merely for the purpose of having you carry the
19 amendment into effect on your blue paper, blue copy.
