5 control by the legislature, but desire the legislature
6 to have control to decide whether other principal depart-
7 ments should be headed by a single executive or by a
8 board, you would vote for the amendment to the amendment.
9 and then vote for the amendment as amended.

10 If you desire that the board of education not be
11 subject to be changed by the legislature and that all
12 other departments be headed by a single executive, without
13 the right on the part of the legislature to change it,
14 you would vote against the amendment to the amendment and
15 then vote for the amendment.

16 If you desired the third alternative, to give the
17 legislature the power to decide whether principal depart-
18 ments, including boards of education, should be headed by
19 single executives, or by a board, you could vote either for
20 or against the amendment to the amendment, but in any event,
21 vote against the amendment so that the committee's
