2 out how we should vote can make up our minds in that
3 respect.

4 THE CHAIRMAN: Let the Chair make a suggestion,
5 that rather than do that, since you are talking about the
6 question which is raised by Delegate Maurer's amendment,
7 there is an entirely different question which ought to
8 be resolved first, and that is, whether or not the legis-
9 lature is to have power to determine that boards of
10 education, or that departments of education may be headed
11 by single executives or boards; the legislature ought
12 or ought not to have the power to so decide for other
13 agencies.

14 If you decide that question, then you have left
15 only the question as to whether the legislature should
16 have power over educational institutions.

18 DELEGATE MORGAN: Mr. Chairman, I thought
19 the problem of education had been referred to another
20 committee. I didn't know that we were going to solve
21 all the problems of education until we at least had had a
