

1 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Bard.

2 DELEGATE BARD: Delegate Morgan, it seems to
3 that you have overdrawn the reply. There was no implica-
4 tion that my response meant that you could never make any
5 change whatsoever in the system. That would certainly be
6 a very foolish response on the part of anyone. The
7 response merely indicated that the Department of Educa-
8 tion would not be harnessed with the kind of structure
9 that is stated in 4.20 and, Mr. Chairman, may I ask Dele-
10 gate Morgan a question?

11 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Morgan., do you yield to
12 a question?
