

1 concerned what Delegate Dulany feels is a saving clause,
2 to the extent practicable, is perhaps not at all a saving
3 clause.

4 I find it difficult to see that at the same
5 time that clause operates to allow the redistricting
6 commission to do what is necessary and yet Carroll County
7 or any other county gets more protection than they would
8 from 3.02.

11 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Mr. Chairman, in review-
12 ing what is taking place this evening, it occurs to me that
13 various members of this Convention who reside as they all do
14 in some particular locality have begun to enter into the
15 process of redistricting so that they have specific
16 problems, and plans before them, and I am compelled to
17 say at this point that if every political subdivision comes
18 forward at this time with a general proposition which is
19 designed to take care of a particular need or problem or
20 threat, that what we are in effect doing here is legis-
21 lating rather than writing a Constitution.
