

1 My good friend, the Chairman of the Committee,
2 mentions one bill. It so happens I happened to be up in
3 the country over the weekend and I have, I suppose, a fairly
4 decent house, but I had a squirrel in it, but am I going to
5 burn my house down to get the squirrel out? We have a good
6 procedure under the present Constitution and it has been
7 working for the last hundred years, and it is listed in
8 the Constitution, where a majority of the elected members
9 of the body shall be the necessary constitutional majority.

10 We in the Convention are operating under a 72-
11 vote majority of the body.

12 We also passed in the executive branch just
13 yesterday, on the return of vetoed bills from the Gover-
14 nor's office; the bill was passed by the affirmative vote
15 of three-fifths of all the members of each house.

19 If we are going to permit three-fifths vote on vetoed
20 bills of all the members then I think it ought to be three-
21 fifths vote of all the members of both bodies to pass a
