

1 think we ought to be consistent throughout the entire
2 Constitution once the decision has been made, so that there
3 won't be different kinds of a majority, and therefore I
4 would urge that we adopt Amendment No. 16 as well.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate B. Miller.

6 DELEGATE B. MILLER: Is it not true that in other
7 constitutions there is a difference in the kind of majority
8 required for expulsion and the kind of majority that is
9 required for the passage of bills?

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Gallagher.

11 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Yes.

12 Some of the states do vary with respect to this,
13 but again I say that in the interest of having a consistent
14 Constitution on the question of what kind of majority
15 vote is necessary to undertake various activities, I would
16 personally prefer that the same kind of a majority be used
17 throughout the entire Constitution.

18 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Miller, do you desire to
19 speak on the question?

20 DELEGATE B. MILLER: Yes, sir.
