2 chamber was considering an amendment. You could vote on the
3 amendment and then on the bill on final passage, with the
4 amendments attached. That is one situation, and the other
5 situation would be where the bill had been returned to the
6 house of origin with amendments and in both those situations,
7 the amendments under the rules have to be on the members'
8 desks.

10 DELEGATE DELLA: Mr. Chairman, when the bill is
11 introduced and amended in the house of origin, those amend-
12 ments are printed into the bill, so when you read the bill
13 you can read the amendments in the bill itself. When the
14 bill is then amended in the second house, there must be
15 five copies of the amendment offered, and one of those
16 copies, by rule, is given to the printer and one goes to
17 the journal clerk, so you have a copy of the amendment.
18 There is no writing in. They must be typed and offered and
19 then the amendments are offered to the membership, so they
20 know what they are voting on, and when the amendments are
21 adopted, five copies of the amendments are attached to the
