12 DELEGATE GLEASON: When the five copies are deliv-
13 ered to the rostrum with the proposed amendment to the
14 second house, is a copy of that amendment put on everyone's
15 desk before the vote?

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Della.

17 DELEGATE DELLA: The amendment is offered by a
18 member, and before the body votes on that amendment, those
19 members had a copy of what they are voting on.

20 Now, if the amendment is adopted, then you have
21 142 copies of that amendment sent over with the bill and the
