

1 DELEGATE CASE: Mr. Chairman, so that the record
2 can be absolutely straight on this subject, could it show
3 that the words, in writing, are intended to embrace the
4 procedure which has been described here by Delegates
5 Gallagher and Della and Gleason and James, or some varia-
6 tion of that procedure, but in any event do not mean hand-
7 written script as a quote, in writing amendment, quote,
8 which would be permissive.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Case, the Chair thinks
10 two things are embraced in your comment. I think everyone
11 recognizes that the procedure outlined by Delegate James
12 and Delegate Della is largely a matter of the rules of the
13 several houses, and I did not understand from the Chairman
14 of this committee that it was intended by these words to
15 require that a copy of the written amendment be on every-
16 body's desk. That would still be left to rule.

17 The second part of your question I think is
18 correct, namely, that it is intended by the use of the
19 words, in writing, to mean something other than handwritten
20 script; whether it be by typewriter, by letter press or
21 offset, or multigraph or anything of the sort, and I take it
