

1 sentence, that the Committee has adopted all final Committee  
2 votes on all bills, Mr. Chairman, I don't know how that could  
3 be even carried out.

4 Now, if a bill is sent to a Committee, you only  
5 need three signatures in the Senate to bring it out. Now,  
6 if you can't get three signatures on a bill that is in a  
7 Committee with an unfavorable report, Lord help the bill.

8 Now, in the House, to recall a bill from a  
9 Committee, that requires 15 signatures. I think we are  
10 getting into serious deep water, especially when, or if you  
11 consider bonds.

12 I don't know whether this particular phrase  
13 requires the Committee to have a journal and whether those  
14 votes must be recorded in that journal of that Committee, or  
15 when the Chairman must report that a Committee had acted on  
16 a bill which they may have voted unfavorable today, that  
17 they can reconsider tomorrow and bring it out with a favorable  
18 report. What I think you are doing is littering, frankly  
19 filling up the journal of that particular House with a lot  
20 of reports that may be changed from one day to another, and  
21 then I come to the responsibility of the Chairman himself.
