

1 Chair completely misunderstood your earlier intent, this
2 amendment would defeat a different intent that you have.

3 Is it your intent that the exception beginning
4 in line 38 applies only to the two immediately preceding
5 phrases, or does it now apply all the way back to the
6 beginning of the sentence, and include the phrase begin-
7 ning on line 31 and continuing 32, "no vote on final passage",
8 in other words, may a vote on final passage be taken
9 without the written bill and amendments being before
10 the House, if three-fifths of the members permit?

11 I took it from what you said earlier that you
12 did not intend that result, but it may be that gramatically
13 that would be the construction of the sentence.

14 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: Mr. Chairman, we did not
15 intend to do away with that particular requirement.

16 THE CHAIRMAN: Could we leave that to the
17 Committee on Style but have it stated quite clearly,
18 Delegate Penniman, that this sentence, as reconstructed,
19 is not intended to mean that by three-fifths vote of the
20 House a vote on final passage of the bill could be
21 taken before the bill and all amendments thereto were
