2 DELEGATE GALLAGHER: That is correct, Mr.

4 I will withdraw the amendment then, if you feel
5 it can be accomplished without it.

6 THE CHAIRMAN: I think read the amendment
7 with the further clarification to be accomplished by
8 the Committee on Style.

9 Delegate Marion.

10 DELEGATE MARION: Mr. Chairman, I am
11 frank to admit I don't understand what this sentence will
12 mean, if we adopt the amendment, because we will begin
13 the sentence with an exception, and we will end the
14 sentence with an exception, and I won't know whether we
15 have created an exception to the exception and where we
16 stand when we get to the middle of the sentence.

17 THE CHAIRMAN: I think the Chair can state it.

18 If I correctly understood the chairman of the
19 committee, the first exception, that is, the one at the
20 beginning of the sentence, applies to everything that
21 follows.
