

1 or so. To delay the effective date of a bill would be
2 extremely burdensome.

3 Also the compilation of the rules of court which
4 now take in a separate section of the Code are never up to
5 date. I mean rules are passed and there may be a half-
6 dozen which have come out in between the publication. Some
7 of them are emergencies and have important changes, and to
8 say that you have to wait until the whole compilation has
9 been published and brought up to date before a law can take
10 effect, would impose an insuperable barrier as a practical
11 matter.

12 I am in sympathy with the objects of this, but
13 I think it is a matter which has to be left to the legis-
14 lature.
