

1 the Whole was about to take up the Majority Report,  
2 certainly upon appropriate motion, made by the spokesman  
3 for the Minority, the matter could be postponed and  
4 could be set as a special order of business on a day  
5 certain, namely, one or two days after the Minority Report  
6 is distributed to the deals. If the request was reason-  
7 able, certainly a majority of the delegates would approve  
8 it. If it was used, for instance, in a situation where  
9 there had been a ten day, where the Majority Report had laid  
10 in the Committee of the Whole nor ten days and on the  
11 tenth day the Minority comes forth and says, Well, we  
12 really haven't had an opportunity to draft our Minority  
13 Report, well, in that sort of a situation, the majority of  
14 the delegates might well question the bona fides of such a  
15 belated request. In any event, it would be something  
16 that would repose in the collective judgment of the  
17 majority of the delegates to this Convention. So in  
18 short, we believe that the Rules as they now stand provide  
19 adequate protection, and furnish a guarantee that the  
20 Minority Report will be printed and treated equally with  
21 the Majority Report in the opportunity to reach the floor
