2 objectors; I am speaking to all of you now as possible
3 dissenters to a Majority Report. I am suggesting that
4 any report or any rule that depends on as many nebulous and
5 uncertain items as the Chairman of the Committee has
6 presented here today either deserves a serious consider-
7 ation and a look favorable from you, or perhaps further
8 study.

9 Look at the words that have been used,
10 reasonableness, depends on the will of the majority of
11 those on the floor -- why should a Minority Report be
12 subject to the majority vote of the Convention? Why should
13 it have the same privileges as the Majority Report? Why
14 should it be allowed to come in automatically within a
15 certain number of days?

16 This being the case, Mr. President and Mr.
17 Chairman, I move that the Report be tabled at this time to
18 allow the delegates further opportunity for study.

19 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Rybczynski, so you
20 mean to move to table or to recommit? You could do
21 either, of course.
