

1 copy for each delegate and sufficient copies for the  
2 press, the information service, the Chief Clerk's office,  
3 and everywhere else. Already there are indications that  
4 on some things, at least, this will not be sufficient.  
5 We have been asked to, on some documents, to have a copy  
6 delivered to the member's desk in his committee room,  
7 as well as here in the chamber. That alone would mean 284  
8 copies so that we may have to increase the number.

9 May I ask that any of you who have suggestions  
10 as to either a better distribution, a faster distribution,  
11 a more orderly distribution, would you please pass the  
12 word along, either through your committee chairman or  
13 direct. I would also ask that you give us a written  
14 memorandum, not because we want to be formal but simply  
15 because my memory will not retain all of the messages I  
16 have been getting in the corridor, and I am afraid I will  
17 forget. If you think that any matter at all can be  
18 improved procedurally, if you would just dictate a memoran-  
19 dum to my secretary in the office, she will get it to me;  
20 and I assure you that we will do everything possible to meet  
21 these suggestions. After all, the organization of the
