

1 in guaranteeing a delegate the right to have his colleagues
2 know about his proposal and to have a vote upon it if he
3 insists upon it at the proper time.

4 We think to require the committees to grind
5 out memoranda in each case where the total proposals have
6 already reached or is approaching 400 and may exceed or
7 approach 800 would be very unreasonable and for that
8 reason we recommend that Resolution 11 not be adopted
9 although we have indicated our general sympathy that the
10 procedures be administered fairly so that an individual
11 delegate learns at some time whether the committee intends
12 to act favorably or unfavorably or to consider his proposal
13 at all.

14 THE PRESIDENT: Are there any questions of the
15 chairman for the purposes of clarification? Delegate
16 Boileau.

17 DELEGATE BOILEAU: Mr. President, I believe
18 there is one other alternative a person would have which
19 would be to convince 20 per cent of the committee to
20 provide a minority report and also resulting in the minority
21 report coming on the floor of the Committee of the whole.
