I believe that I believe that the demands of the we are one nation. times are so great that teamwork among the officials of the Federal and State Governments is essential to our survival; and I hope I am wrong, but it seemed to me that our President was declaring war on the Federal Government, which in reality would be declaring war on ourselves.

I believe that we must face the fact that
there are some problems of this State, and the rest of the
States of this Union, such as the protection of human
rights, the building of highways, the conservation of our
natural resources, which are so intertwined that no one
