9 reference to our duty and responsibility to posterity?

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Hardwicke.

11 DELEGATE HARDWICKE: Because, Mr. Chairman --

12 DELEGATE JAMES: Mr. Chairman, could I clarify
13 that?

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate James.

15 DELEGATE JAMES: The thing I am getting at is
16 that in a society such as ours we have duties as well as
17 a right to enjoy. I am wondering why you left out the con-
18 cept of duty.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Hardwicke.

20 DELEGATE HARDWICKE: Delegate James, in stating
21 a philosophy of government, it seems to me that the
