

1 words, there can be no aid directly or indirectly to
2 any school or institution under the control of any
3 religious domination.

4 While this is their attitude and what they want,
5 I think they are inclined to accept the wording of the
6 draft. Now, this is substantially the same view as that
7 of Delegate Gallagher, who made a very eloquent and ob-
8 jective and forthright statement to our committee.

9 I will leave it to him to explain his own views
10 which I am sure he is very capable of doing, and what I
11 want to say is that these knowledgable men and women
12 and concerned groups have had a very persuasive effect
13 upon me and their interpretation and the meaning of the
14 first amendment language.

15 The decision of the Court of Appeals in the
16 Horace Mann case and the Truitt Case are also most
17 persuasive.

18 Now, my conclusion is this and I hope I am
19 stating the view of the Convention, that it is in
20 light of these cases and their significance and their
21 meaning that we have accepted this proposed language. That
