

1 DELEGATE BOILEAU: When the minority
2 went over the wording of this amendment, was there a
3 reason why the word "religion" was chosen rather than the
4 more inclusive and broader term "creed"?

5 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Mitchell.

6 DELEGATE MITCHELL: No, I think that "religion"
7 is the word used in the draft, but if I am not mistaken,
8 there was no decision to substitute the word "religion"
9 for "creed" because it, in fact, does mean the same.

10 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Boileau.

11 DELEGATE BOILEAU: Rather than enter into a
12 debate, I don't think it means the same, but I will hold
13 off until later.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further questions of the
