

1 DELEGATE MORGAN: Mr. Chairman, this colloquy
2 this afternoon prompted me to ask Delegate Mitchell a
3 question. Is this supposed to be a limitation on the
4 General Assembly to legislate in this field, or is it
5 supposed to say what the General Assembly can't do?

6 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Mitchell:

7 DELEGATE MITCHELL: No. I think this is in the
8 way of a mandate to the General Assembly, to act in this
9 area, and I don't think this is any limitation on what
10 the General Assembly can and should do in response to the
11 needs of the state.

12 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Morgan.

13 DELEGATE MORGAN: And if the General Assembly
14 would find it essential at some time in the future to
15 legislate in what you might call the private sector of
16 the economy, there is nothing in this language which
17 would prevent them from doing so?

18 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Mitchell.

19 DELEGATE MITCHELL: No, I don't believe so,
20 because I believe there is some concern about what the
21 private sector really means, and where is the line to be
