2 I would suggest to you that the basic rights  
3 for the declaration of rights in the Federal and state  
4 Constitution are perhaps the most widely read provisions  
5 of the Constitution by the people, not only of this state,  
6 but of the United States.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: You have one-quarter minute.

8 DELEGATE HARGROVE: I think they are entitled  
9 to be able to read exactly what the provision means, that  
10 is, that there shall be no discrimination by the state  
11 because of race, color, religion or national origin,  
12 and they do not have to look in a law book to find a  
13 definitive or a definition of the word due process and  
14 equal protection of the law.

15 I therefore support the majority amendment.
