7 Amendment Y. This will be Amendment 3A to Amendment
8 3. The Clerk will read the amendment.

9 MR. QUILLEN: Amendment Number 3A to Amendment
10 Number 3, by Delegates Boileau, Borom.

11 On page 1 of the amendment in line 6 strike
12 out the word "religion" and insert in lieu thereof the
13 word "creed".

14 THE CHAIRMAN: The amendment having been
15 submitted by Delegate Boileau and seconded by Delegate
16 Borom, the Chair recognizes Delegate Boileau to speak
17 to the amendment.

18 DELEGATE BOILEAU: Mr. Chairman, fellow dele-
19 gates, we are concerned here primarily with one word,
20 obviously, the word "religion".
