2 DELEGATE HARGROVE: No. You don't have to obtain
3 a warrant under this provision. If you need one, as you
4 know, you can affect a search without a warrant..

5 What I am referring to is where the State acts
6 as an individual in a civil proceeding, and would you bar
7 the State in obtaining the evidence because of this amend-
8 ment, whereas the private citizen could obtain the same
9 information and it could be admissible in a civil case?

10 DELEGATE BOTHE: I think the point of the amend-
11 ment is exactly the opposite to what you state, and that
12 is to make it impossible for a private citizen to do that
13 which the State couldn't do.
