THE PRESIDENT: Record Delegate Pullen as being present.

The Chair recognizes Delegate Powers, Chairman of the Committee on Calendar and Agenda.

DELEGATE POWERS: Mr. President, the Committee on Calendar and Agenda has concluded that the report of the Rules Committee, which is on the agenda, was supposed to be on the agenda for the reason that under Rule 64 there is some question of interpretation as to whether the matter has been in the possession of the delegates for not less than two session days.
