

1 DELEGATE VECERA: Will Delegate Case yield to
2 a question?

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Case?

4 DELEGATE CASE: Yes, sir.

5 THE CHAIRMAN: State the question.

6 DELEGATE VECERA: You have written in the
7 amendment "for petty offenses of the type...". That for
8 me is still not restricted; "of the type" could be inter-
9 preted to open the door to more. Isn't that a fact?
10 Petty offenses has still not been defined.

11 DELEGATE CASE: I think the Chairman explained
12 that in the explanation that he made to Delegate Bamberger's
13 recitation of the amendment.

14 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Vecera.

15 DELEGATE VECERA: In other words, Mr. Chairman,
16 it says "petty offenses of the type..."; so that opens the
17 door. It means anything of this type, whoever wants to de-
18 fine the word type.

19 My first question was whoever wants to define
20 "petty offenses"; now, whoever wants to make an interpre-
21 tation of "type," it would open the door to a great many
