2 ment.' Forfeiture of lands and goods as a punishment for
3 crime has been abolished in both England and the United
4 States so that the term no longer has its original meaning."

5 So we have provided in this present draft of ours
6 a concept that is outmoded and obsolete.

7 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Taylor, you have used
8 seven minutes of your time.

9 DELEGATE TAYLOR: I want to finish by saying
10 that we should at least provide for the restoration of
11 status which is real and meaningful to many people in this
12 Constitution.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Kiefer.

14 DELEGATE KIEFER: Mr. Chairman and ladies and
15 gentlemen:

16 I rise to oppose this amendment, and I will
17 do so by saying to you that this is a concept of reprobation
18 and restoration of criminals. I don't have any
19 objection to it per se, but this is purely a statutory
20 matter. We could literally load this Constitution with
21 all kinds of things similar to this.
