3 This would permit monetary payments where
4 there was no taking, but merely damages. And those of
5 you who believe this will help the little man, my ex-
6 perience in the practice of law is that by and large
7 it is the large corporation, the large landholder who comes
8 in for his biggest share of the take in these cases,
9 I seriously doubt this is going to help the small man.

10 I think it will help the property holder. I
11 think it gets into an area that we have no earthly con-
12 cept of the extent of it. I think the legislature
13 can take care of this without our doing anything. I
14 think they are better prepared to limit it by statute
15 than we are prepared to go into it in our Constitution.
