2 this kind of coercion and intimidation.

3 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Taylor.

4 DELEGATE L. TAYLOR: Also with respect to many
5 employees who are not covered by the Wagner Labor Act;
6 how many employees in the state of Maryland are not
7 covered by the Wagner Labor Act?

8 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Bothe.

9 DELEGATE BOTHE: The statistics which I have,
10 and they are included in the minority report, I believe,
11 was that there are 100,000 agricultural workers -- this
12 is on page 3 of the report -- 250,000 retail and commer-
13 cial employees, another 170,000 in service industries.

14 These are all people that are not covered.

15 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Taylor.

16 DELEGATE L. TAYLOR: In your experience with
17 labor problems, for instance, you mentioned Church
18 Home Hospital employees, trying to select a unit repre-
19 sentative.

20 Do you find that many of these employees are
21 not covered by this federal law, who receive a wage
under the Federal Minimum wage?
