One is that beginning next Tuesday and we hope for the remainder of the Convention, we propose to recess for lunch a half hour later at 1:00 P.M. until 2:30 P.M., thereby reducing a long afternoon by a half hour and lengthening a short morning by a half hour. I say that so that delegates can make their plans accordingly.

Also, for the information of the delegates the Committee Report of the Executive, Committee on the Executive Branch, No. 1, will be on the agenda for Monday and the Committee Recommendation will follow that so that you will have an idea as to what is in store for you between now and Thanksgiving.

I move that we adjourn —

THE PRESIDENT: Before you make the motion, are there any delegates here now who were not present at roll call this afternoon? You may indicate your presence on the roll call.

Delegate Powers, before you make your motion did you want to indicate anything as to the length of the session on Wednesday?

DELEGATE POWERS: On Wednesday the present plan would be that the session would be the same length as the other weekdays but it may be between now and then I think between now and then per-

haps we will provide an agenda that will enable the delegates to leave a little early on that day.

I move we adjourn until 2:00 P.M. on Monday.

THE PRESIDENT: Before you leave and before I put the motion, let me repeat, in case you did not hear, we do plan a session Monday evening, so that the Monday session will be afternoon and evening, just as it was this past week.
