I certainly had a good purpose, and the Committee itself handled the thing in their original recommendation quite well. I am very pleased to note that our legislature has taken many progressive steps along this line, so I believe the matter is well taken care of. I am going to keep a copy of the memo to explain to my friends and relatives who believe in this principle of equal rights and I am going to let the matter rest.

I am not going to bring up my suggested amendment, even in a different form. I think the Committee did a nice job and I am sorry I took so darn much time over the thing when they had done such a good job.
