READING CLERK: Amendment No. 8 to Committee Recommendation GP-8, by Delegates Needle, Hardwicke, and Sollins: On page 1 in line 16 after the word "convention" insert the following words: "or within two years after the governor or General Assembly calls a convention".

THE CHAIRMAN: The amendment having been submitted by Delegate Needle and seconded by Delegates Hardwicke, and Sollins, the Chair recognizes Delegate Needle.

DELEGATE NEEDLE: Mr. Chairman, I ask unanimous consent to delete the words "the governor or" in lines 3 and 4 of the amendment.

THE CHAIRMAN: Is there any objection to modifying the amendment by deleting in lines 3 and 4 the words "the governor or"? The Chair hears none and the amendment will be so modified.
