And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall ascertain and value CHAP. what damages may be sustained by any person or persons through whose land the Who shall as. faid road shall pass, and the same, when so assessed, shall be paid, or secured to certain dabe paid, by the said petitioners, before the said commissioners shall proceed to mages, &c. open the said road; provided always, that if any person or persons through whose land the faid road shall pass, or his, her or their guardian or trustee, shall conceive themselves aggrieved by such valuation and affessment of damages by the faid commissioners, it shall and may be lawful for the said commissioners, or any two of them, to issue their warrant to the sheriff of the county, to summon twelve freeholders of the county, not interested in the premises, and qualified to ferve as jurors in the county court, to appear, on a day by them to be appointed, on the premises; and the said commissioners are hereby authorised to administer an oath to every person so summoned, that he will without favour, affection, prejudice or partiality, affels the damages sustained by the persons at whose request such inquisition shall be taken, by reason of opening the aforesaid road through his, her or their land; and the persons so summoned and sworn shall thereupon proceed to affels and value the damages accordingly, of which the faid petitioners, or some one of them, shall have at least five days previous notice; and fuch inquisition shall be final and conclusive between the parties.

IV. And be it enacted, That the said commissioners shall not lay out or open Road not to the said road through the buildings, gardens or orchards, of any person, with- go through buildings, &c. out his or her consent.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the re- Passed December 30. moval of the seat of justice from Melville's warehouse to Pig-Point, in Caroline county.

Te it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Messieurs William Commission-Richardson, William Potter, George Martin, Henry Downes, Christopher &c. Driver, Joshua Driver and John Bennett, are hereby constituted commissioners, to execute and perform the trusts reposed in them by this act; and in case any of the said commissioners should die, refuse to act, or remove out of the faid county, the others, or a major part of them, shall elect some other fit and proper person or persons of the said county in the room of him or them so dying, refusing to act, or removing out of the said county.

II. And, whereas it is represented to this general assembly, that the owners of the land contiguous to Denton, in Caroline county, are desirous that a village should he surveyed and laid out, with convenient streets, lanes and alleys; therefore, Be it enacted, that the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby au- Who are to survey land, thorifed and empowered, with the consent of the proprietor or proprietors afore- &c. faid, to survey and lay out any quantity of land, not exceeding fifty acres, including the public square called Denton, in Caroline county, and the lands thereto contiguous, and the same, when surveyed, to be erected into a village, and to be called and known by the name of Denton; and fuch village, when furveyed and laid out, to divide into lots, which lots shall be numbered and bounded by stones, at every corner of the same; and the said commissioners, or a majority of them, are hereby authorised and empowered to survey and lay out a sufficient number of streets, not exceeding fifty feet wide, as also a sufficient number of alleys, not exceeding twenty feet wide, through the said village, for the public convenience; and so soon as the rightful proprietor or proprietors of the said lands shall execute a deed or deeds of bargain and sale to the said commissioners, in trust for the use and benesit of the inhabitants of the said county, for such land so laid out for streets and alleys, the same shall become, and for ever thereaster be deemed, public highways to all intents and purposes.
