The deposition of Judith Carke aged two and twenty or thereabouts saith that when that M^r Minor brought the Negro to her Master Elias Saylers he had on his backe one white shirt, one white waistcoat, and further she saith she got the coat out of the depts, and delivered the sd Coat into the sd Minor's hands, and when he had it he showed it to people in the house and said that the Coat, which the man saith is worth so much but the sum I know not and further saith not

Mr. Hopkins I've answered to your request I issued his and try'd after James Minor and accordingly he has in appearance at Gargaphya, I have discoursed him and find him Joye. M^r Minor has proferr'd a satisfaction in reason he can demand for the Negro's transgression, How as to what you asert, he absolutely denies, either contempt or stay, and saith he was before you and you had nothing to say to him, where I suppose was since the date over to me, I've just gone over the day cannot enlarge, only that must intimate, that M^r Minor has written to you in your parts and how, that there is no fear of his abouting till my returne, and upon your letter callor'd with him he otherwise than at present I suggest I shall be ready to give you all further satisfaction relating in that is possible for you to require to show here with Jam.
