William: Willmott Esq.

Somerset County M^r Peter Loder late of Somerset County was attached to answer unto William: Willmott of a plea of trespass upon the Cap.

Esq. Peter: Loder Deft.

And whereas upon the said William by Peter Boul his attorney to complaine that whereas the sd Peter Loder the 18th day of July in the year of our Lord 1689 at Monroan within the Jurisdiction

of this Court was indebted to the said William in the sum of three bushels of wheat being for six quarts of Rye and three pounds and three quarters of Sugar before that time sold to him and the sd Peter to the sd William in manner aforesaid being indebted the sd Peter in consideration thereof did assume upon him self and to the said William then and there faithfully to promise that he the said Peter the said three bushels of wheat when he should be thereto required, would well and truly Content and pay. However that the sd Peter his promise and assumption aforesaid not regarding but mindmg and fraudulently intending the sd William in this behalf carelessly and subtilly to deceive and defraud the sd three bushels of wheat or any part thereof to the said William hath not paid, although the sd Peter to do the same by the said William afterwards was required, but the same to pay hath refused and still doth refuse to the damage of the sd William of 1000 pounds of tobacco and three of his being to his suit on
