Memorandum. at the request of M<sup>r</sup>. Samuel Hopkins. this following Cause which should properly have been inserted in the 15<sup>th</sup> days & proceedings is as followeth - so Hopkins having speedy occasion for the same

Declaracion being Read. Issue was joyned. and the whole Cause referred to a Jury of twelve men duly impanelled & sworn.

Somerset County M<sup>r</sup>. Samuel Hopkins of this County was summoned to answer unto Walter Taylor of the said County in an action of the Case. - And whereupon the plt by his attorney John Taylor returned and says about the month of August last past the sd Samuel Hopkins did buy of the plt twelve Culls of Cypress Timber, for the which the sd Hopkins did promise to pay unto the sd Taylor, two only two yards of the best sort of the where full measure of London Broadgate which sd measure to pay doth utterly duty to pay although often the same required by the plt, but part of the Timber was retained and the rest was being taken for him to retain, but could not carry it at that time by which fraudulent means the plt saith he is damaged to the value of forty four yards of the like timber. and thereupon brings his suit

And whereas the deft by James Sangster his attorney comes and defends the force and injury of and saith that plt his action ought not to have 1<sup>st</sup> because the defendant is ready to hold Covenant and bargain with the plt, upon the delivery of the 12 Culls of Cypress Timber, 2<sup>ly</sup> the plt by the delivery of part as is aforesaid hath not named the quantity being contentious of the fraudulent and deceit of the same, paying the defendant with half the quantity of Culls that he agreed for, thereby treating the defendant, and spoiling his timber, as may appear upon view 3<sup>ly</sup> whereas the plt saith that he hath not carryed all the Culls truthfully implying that the whole must be delivered, and good service to sufficient Culls before satisfaction, till such delivery and payment be made, thereupon no cause of action Sangster pr<sup>o</sup> def<sup>o</sup>ndt.

Then was this the following paper presented to Court & Jury.

(1<sup>st</sup>) That the persons whose names are hereunder subscribed were requested by Samuel Hopkins to view all part of Cypress Timber standing in the sd Hopkins to have had, which timber Hopkins aforesaid hath sent him by Walter Taylor or his Order. Now we the sd persons subscribed as aforesaid do hereby certify that we have seen unto all persons whom these may or doth concern that we have deliberately viewed, stam and compared the sd timber, both as to quantity and quality and to the value thereof
