favourous continuance therein and that it may be with all speed sent to  
their Majesty: ~~\_\_\_\_\_~~ Immediately after y<sup>e</sup> Justice of y<sup>e</sup> Court  
signed the draft, and so did many others that attended the Court.

Then the Court ordered that the aforesaid draft when finished should  
be sent over the Bay, in order to be presented to their Majesty.  
It was then likewise ordered by the Court that when y<sup>e</sup> said draft was sent  
over the Bay that it should be certified there that the Court had appointed  
and made M<sup>r</sup>. William Dorton High Sheriff of this County in stead and  
place of Cap<sup>t</sup>. William Whittington.

The same day y<sup>e</sup> Court ordered the Grand Jury one gallon of Rye to be  
paid of M<sup>r</sup>. Andrew Whittington, payable from y<sup>e</sup> County's Levy. and

Ordered that the County Levy be paid y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> of this day in Jan<sup>y</sup>  
And then this Court is adjourned.
